#### Willy Wonka's Nutty Crunch Surprise!

To celebrate Roald Dahl day 2021, below is a fun recipe inspired by one of Roald Dahl's famous books.

#### Ingredients:

- 14oz milk chocolate (broken into small pieces)
- 4 tbsp unsalted butter
- 5 tbsp corn syrup
- 5oz almonds
- 6 plain rich tea biscuits (finely crushed)
- 1oz rice krispies
- Vanilla extract
- ½ cup of sugar

#### Method:

Step 1: Put 7oz of milk chocolate, 4 tbsp of unsalted butter and 5tbsp of corn syrup into a bowl and place over a saucepan of simmering water. Stir occasionally until melted (or place the bowl into a microwave oven and cook on high for about 1 ½ minutes).

Step 2: Add 3oz almonds, 6 finely crushed rich tea biscuits, 1oz rice krispies and the vanilla extract, and mix well.

Step 3: Spoon the mixture into a shallow pan lined with baking paper. Press the mixture down firmly with the back of a fork, creating a level surface.

Step 4: Refrigerate until cool, then cut into bars.

Step 5: Once the bars are ready, make the nutty crunch. Begin by placing 2 tbsp of water and ½ a cup of sugar in a small saucepan. Cook over a low heat until the sugar has dissolved. Do not stir, but occasionally swirl the pan around gently. Once the sugar has dissolved, increase the heat and stir constantly until the sugar caramelises and turns golden brown – about 2 to 3 minutes.

Step 6: Remove from the heat. Working quickly, add the remaining chopped almonds, stir thoroughly, and dip one end of each bar into the mixture. Place the bars on a sheet of buttered baking paper to set.

Step 7: Melt another 7oz of milk chocolate (this can be done in the same way as step 1). Once it has melted, remove from the heat and dip the other end of each bar into the melted chocolate.

Step 8: Let the bars cool on a sheet of baking paper.



#### Parking outside of school:

#### School Lottery – WE HAVE A WINNER!


This week's results are in! Our winning supporter is Ms G from Leek who has won £20.
