

Learning journey map Key Stage 2 MFL

La France et La Monde

Cultural study looking at where French is spoken around the world. Pupils to learn about countries and nationalities. Focus on noun gender, adjectival agreement and the spoken and written differences this creates.



KS3 MFL Curriculum Intents:

Our years 7 and 8 key stage 3 curriculum introduces the Spanish language and builds upon the groundworks laid in key stage 2 and follows the requirements set out in the national curriculum. By the end of year 8, pupils will have taken steps towards being able and respond to a variety of authentically sourced spoken and written language. Pupils will have developed the confidence to communicate, in both oral and written form with increasing fluency and spontaneity, develop their understanding and use of key grammatical structures and develop appreciation for another culture All of these aims will help pupil's foster a love for learning languages which can be used as a solid foundation to build on further at the high school.

La Nourriture et les Boissons

Cultural study of French cuisine. Pupils are to use the present tense to say what are/ aren't eating and drinking. Pupils will express preferences and opinions for different foods and drinks. Conversation building and native speaker listening skills are the focus o this journey.



La Famille et les Amis

My family and Friends
Pupils will use the description skills form the previous journey to introduce and describe their family and friends. Focus on speaking/listening and writing skills.

Mon Auto-Portraits

Pupils will learn about colours and parts of the body and use these to describe their hair and eye colour. Pupils will also describe their personalities. An understanding of noun gender and adjectival agreement will be developed. Pupils will also have opportunity to take part in a traditional French song.

Bienvenue de 'Year 6'

Pupils will look to confidently introduce themselves and describe their appearance. Adjectival agreement will be revisited and pronunciation will be recapped.

Bienvenue de 'Year 5'

Pupils will receive an introduction to French.
Cultural study exploring why we learn French. Basic conversation and listening skills looking at how to introduce ourselves.



Pupils will be introduced to vocabulary for free time activities. Pupils will construct sentences using common present tense verbs joue, fais, vais (play, do, go). Pupils will also recognize how spelling of verbs change when using preferences. Pupils will also add simple opinions.

This is achieved establishing a nurturing and 'safe to fail' learning environment where pupils a by following the requirements set out in the national curriculum. By the end of year 6 pupils should feel secure in understanding and responding to familiar spoken and written language though support will still need to be given at times. Spoken language will be with mostly accurate pronunciation and pupils will have a developing spontaneity to communicate what they want to say. All learning journeys are grounded in practical and relatable topics. Clear links are made with other subjects to promote transferable skills. As a result, pupils discover and see relevance in cultural comparisons, grammar skills and chosen vocabulary to develop a growing appreciation and confidence of the language studied.
