

Churnet Views PSHE curriculum:

PSHE allows our pupils to become healthy, independent and responsible members of society. It aims to uphold our core values and provide pupils with a deeper knowledge of the world around them, while allowing them to develop as individuals and gain a better understanding of themselves and others.

Our pupils are encouraged to think critically and evaluate a range of age-appropriate scenarios and topics that are designed to prepare them for the diverse society that we live in as well as support for their own physical and emotional wellbeing.

KS2 PSHE curriculum intents:

During key stage 2 pupils learn about themselves as growing and changing individuals with their own experiences and ideas, and as members of their communities.

They learn about the wider world and the interdependence of communities within it. They develop their sense of social justice and moral responsibility and begin to understand that their own choices and behaviour can affect local, national or global issues and political and social institutions. They learn how to take part more fully in school and community activities.

As they begin to develop into young adults, they face the changes of puberty and move to Key Stage 3 with support and encouragement from their school. They learn how to make more confident and informed choices about their health and environment; to take more responsibility, individually and as a group, for their own learning; and to resist bullying.
