Countries and Nationalities Pupils will explore Spanish speaking countries around the world and explore the cultural similarities and differences in each. Pupils will be able to describe where they and others are from. Pupils will also say where would like to go. they

Pupils will learn about air travel and how an airport works (life skill). Pupils will learn the vocabulary for transport and say how they would travel to different places using adjectives and giving preferences and opinions.

**Preferences and Opinions** Pupils will build on the previous conversation by introducing their preferences, opinions and recommendations.

#### ¡Mi Escuela!

**Giving Opinions** Pupils will build on the previous journey by giving and asking for simple opinions about school subjects and their school day. Pupils will also hear the opinions of Spanish children.

#### ¡Mi Ciudad!

**Giving Directions** (Adverbials of place)

Pupils will build on the previous journey by using prepositions, imperative verbs, ordinal numbers and questioning to create clear sets of directions and instructions. Pupils will explore maps/ key facts about famous Spanish speaking towns and cities.

### ¡Mi Ciudad!

Describing where we live Pupils start off by looking at a case study of Barcelona and making cultural comparisons between there and the UK. Pupils will then learn to describe where they live by looking at places in the town, basic adjectives, quantities and negatives.



#### Como y Bebo

Maintaining a conversation Pupils will look at different types of Spanish cuisine and compare with their own diet. Pupils will focus on conversation skills and take part in a restaurant role play.

Students will be entering year 7 with a developing love and interest in language acquisition and with a appreciation of other cultures. Pupils should feel secure in understanding and responding to familiar spoken and written language, though support will still need to be given at times. Spoken language will be with mostly accurate pronunciation and pupils will have a developing spontaneity to communicate what they want to say. The main topics covered include:

Pupils will say whether they/ others have or don't have pets (negatives). This provides a further context where pupils can demonstrate their speaking and understanding of basic descriptions. Pupils will have the opportunity to explore and compare the wildlife in Spanish speaking countries and the UK.

#### <u>Greetings</u>

Pupils will learn how to meet and greet people in Spanish and will look to introduce them selves in a basic way including their name, age, birthday. The main focus on this topic will be pronunciation, basic phonics and holding simple conversations.

#### ¡Hablo en Español!

Describing myself and others

Pupils will learn to introduce and talk about themselves and their family through the use of simple adjectives. This will introduce pupils to the concept of aender and agreement and will allow detail to develop into their speaking.

#### Churnet View's MFL Curriculum:

The MFL curriculum at Churnet View has been developed to inspire and allow pupils to develop a love for languages and other cultures. Learning another language will provide pupils with the culturally enriching opportunities which will help them understand their place in the multi-cultural society we live in by providing an opening into another culture to explore. Our learning journeys are based around real world scenarios which are interesting and relatable to pupils allowing pupils to compare their learning with their own experiences of the world. Pupils are taught skills through speaking, listening, reading and writing to ensure they develop their linguistic competence alongside their grammar and vocabulary.

#### KS3 MFL Curriculum intents:

Our years 7 and 8 key stage 3 curriculum introduces the Spanish language and builds upon the groundworks laid in key stage 2 and follows the requirements set out in the national curriculum. By the end of year 8, pupils will have taken steps towards being able and respond to a variety of authentically sourced spoken and written language. Pupils will have developed the confidence to communicate, in both oral and written form with increasing fluency and spontaneity, develop their understanding and use of key grammatical structures and develop appreciation for another culture All of these aims will help pupil's foster a love for learning languages which can be used as a solid

foundation to build on further at the high school.
